# Two new funding announcements



- \$105 million in formula grants
- State agencies are eligible entities (including DC, territories)
- Mandatory funding
- Authorized through Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (aka health reform)

# Funding announcements (cont'd)

- **State Personal Responsibility Education Program**
  - \$55 million in formula grants
  - Encouraged to replicate or substantially incorporate elements of evidence-based models
- **Title V State Abstinence Education Grant Program**
  - \$50 million in formula grants
  - Medically accurate abstinence education programs, and mentoring , counseling, and adult supervision

# Youth in Foster Care

- By age 19, 48% of teen girls in foster care have been pregnant.
- By age 21, over ½ of young women and nearly 1/3 of young men in foster care have had at least one child.
- Youth who have been in foster care are more likely to have sex at a young age, forced sex, an unintended or non-marital birth, and an STD; they are less likely to use contraception at first sex than their peers.

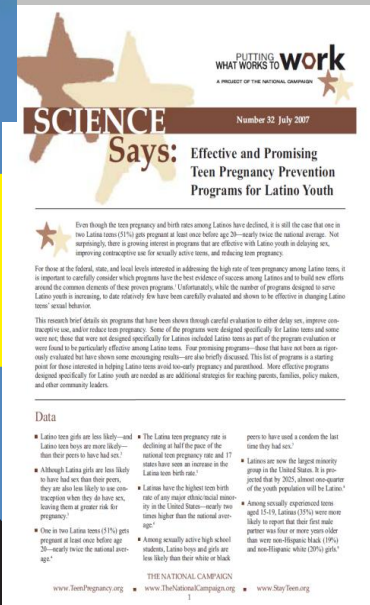
