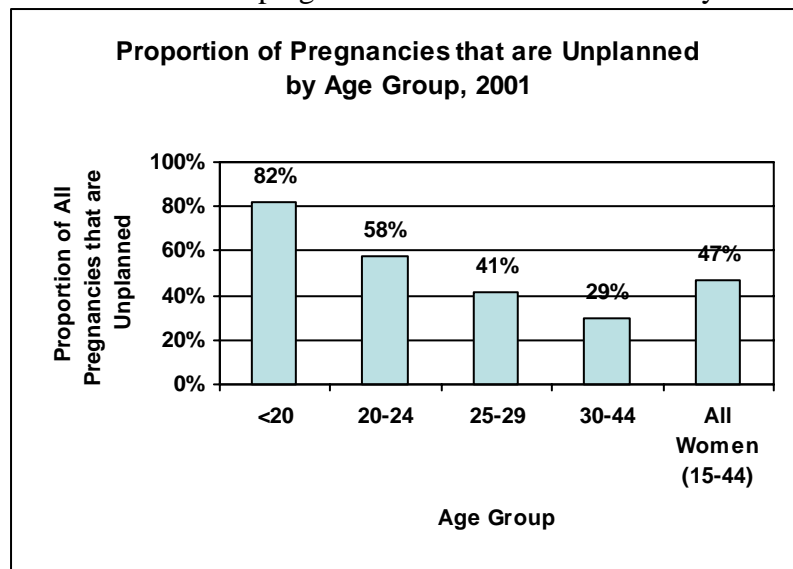




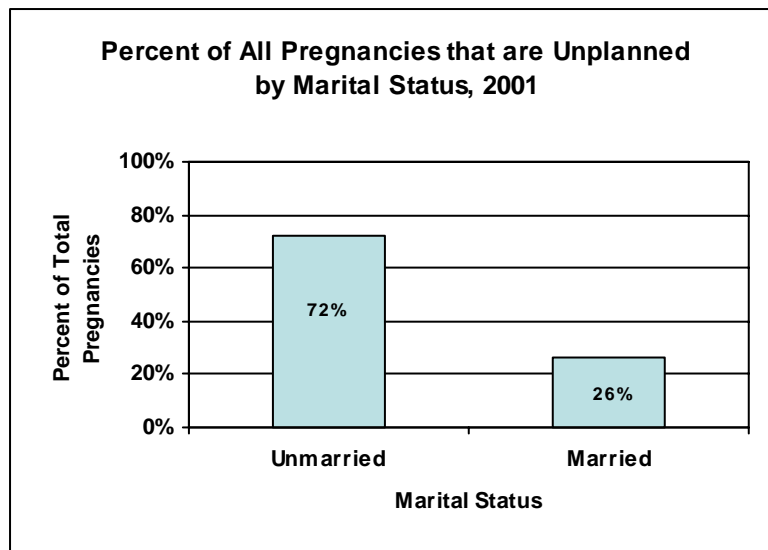
Proportion of All Pregnancies that are Unplanned by Various Socio-Demographics, 2001

Nearly half of all pregnancies in the United States are unplanned—almost 3 million pregnancies. The proportion of all pregnancies that are unplanned varies by socio-demographic factors and is particularly high among single 20-somethings. The following figures provide a brief snapshot of unplanned pregnancies in the United States. The proportion of all pregnancies that are unplanned is highest among teenagers. In addition, more than half of all pregnancies to women in their early 20s are unplanned.

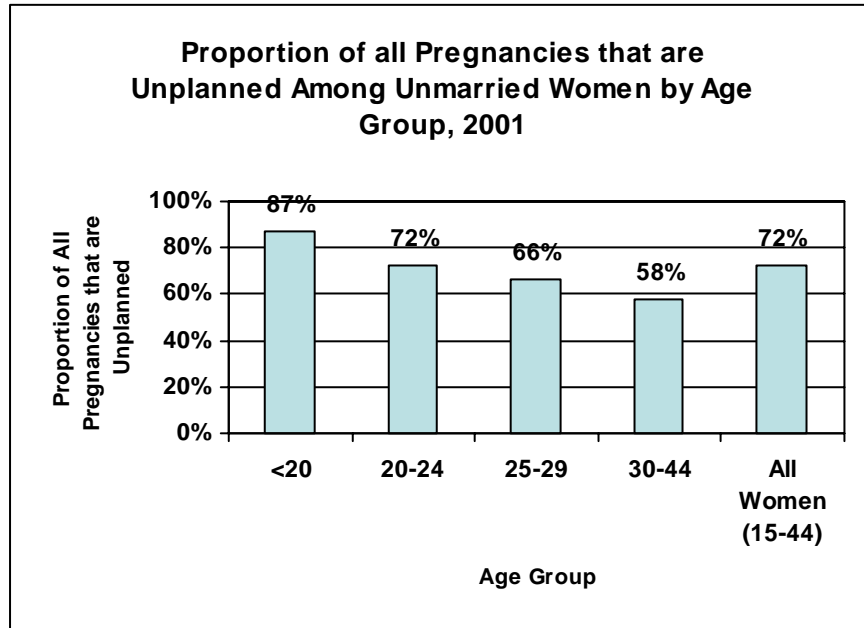


Almost three-quarters of all pregnancies to unmarried women are unplanned.

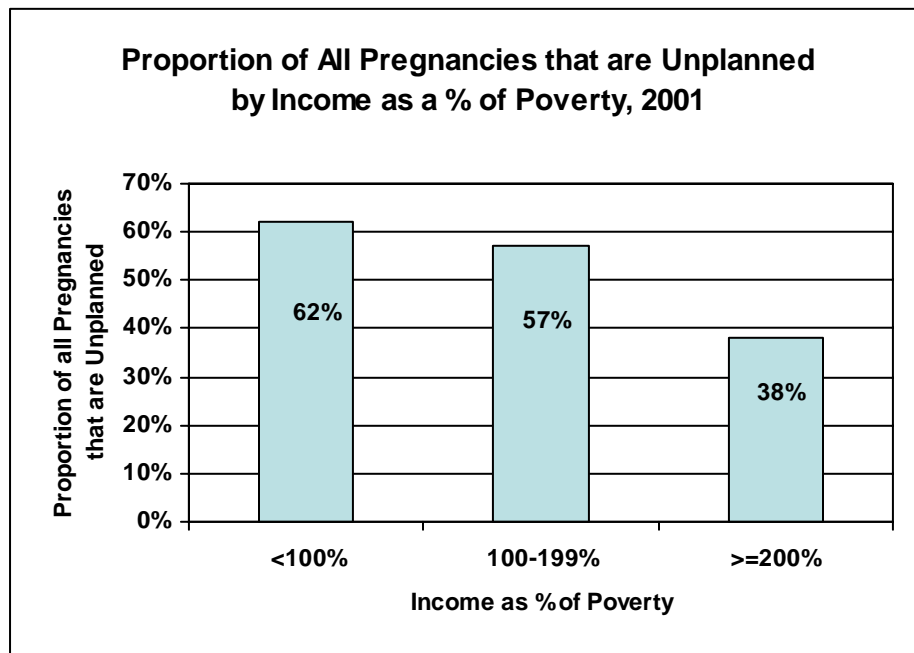




Among unmarried women, the proportion of pregnancies that are unplanned is high across all age groups.

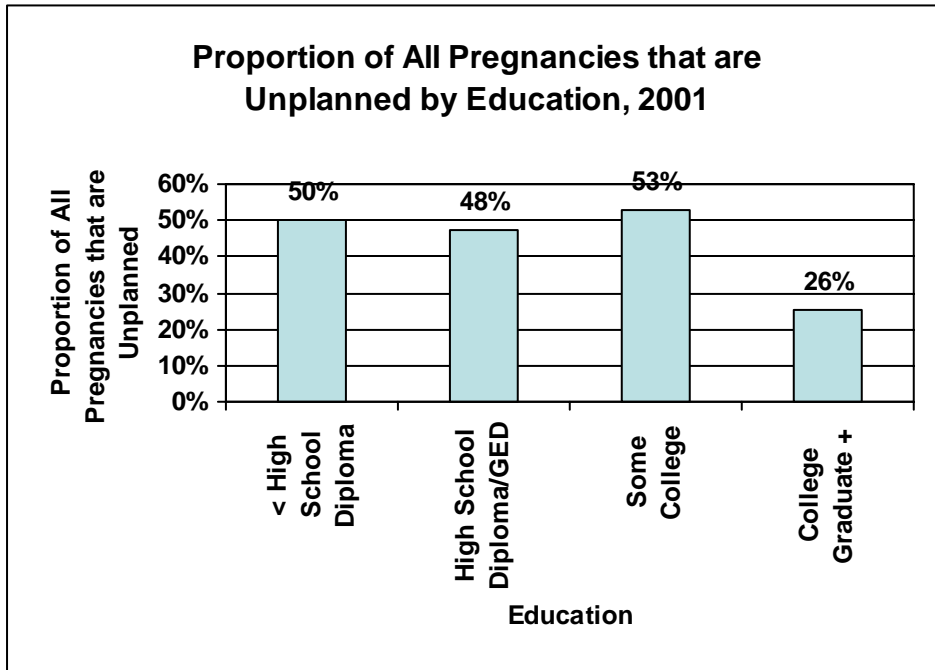


More than half of all pregnancies to women at less than 200% of poverty are unplanned.





The proportion of all pregnancies that are unplanned varies slightly by educational attainment, but is high across nearly all groups.



The proportion of all pregnancies that are unplanned varies by race/ethnicity.
