NOTES:

- 1) Negative numbers reflect that there were actually more teen births for this racial/ethnic group than there would have been if teen birth rates had remained at 1991 levels, usually indicating that the teen birth rate for this group increased in the state. - 2) Estimates are not shown for some racial/ethnic groups because the number of teens in those groups in the state are too small to develop reliable birth rate estimates.
- 3) For some states, the numbers for racial/ethnic groups shown do not add to the total because the total includes groups not shown separately.
- 4) The District of Columbia is included with states for this purpose.

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
