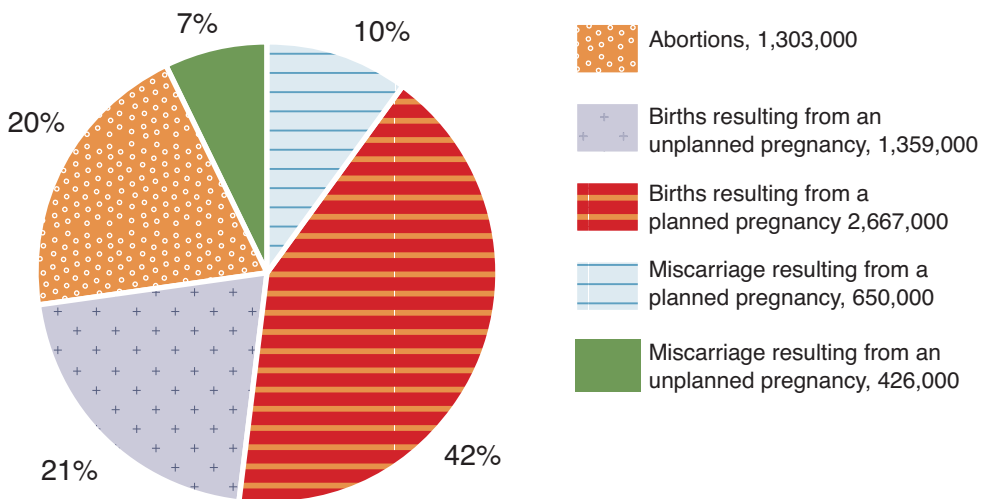


## A-1. Distribution of All Pregnancies by Pregnancy Resolution, 2001<sup>1</sup>

- ▲ Approximately one-half of the 6.4 million pregnancies in 2001 (the most recent year for which adequate data are available) in the United States were unplanned.
- ▲ Approximately 3 million pregnancies are unplanned. These three million unplanned pregnancies include 1.3 million pregnancies that ended in abortion<sup>2</sup>, 1.4 million that resulted in a live birth, and 426,000 that resulted in a miscarriage.
