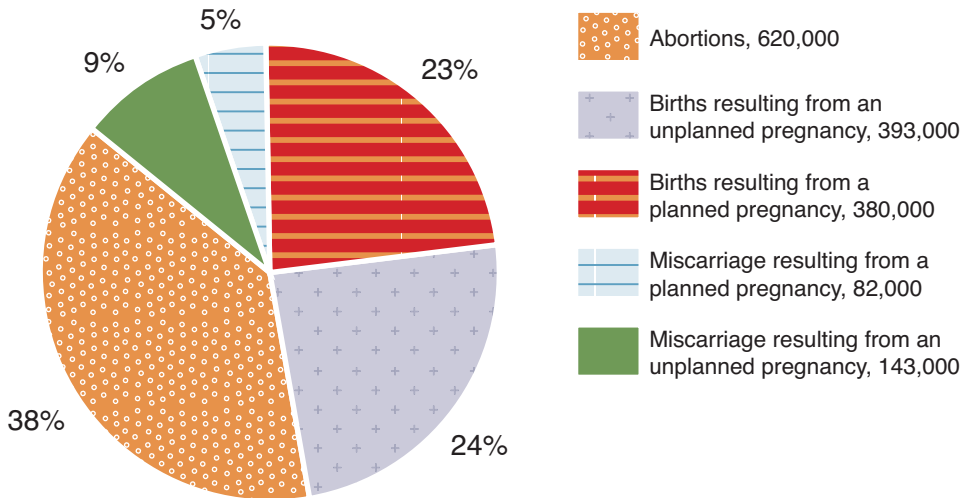


## B -1. Distribution of Unmarried Women Age 20–29 with a Pregnancy by Planning Status and Pregnancy Resolution, 2001<sup>1</sup>

- ▲ There were 1.6 million pregnancies to unmarried women aged 20-29 in 2001, and more than 1.1 million were unplanned.
- ▲ That is, 71 percent of all pregnancies to unmarried 20-somethings are unplanned.
- ▲ These 1.1 million unplanned pregnancies include nearly 600,000 pregnancies that ended in abortion<sup>2</sup>; nearly 400,000 live births that women reported were unplanned at the time of conception; and 143,000 miscarriages of unplanned pregnancies.
