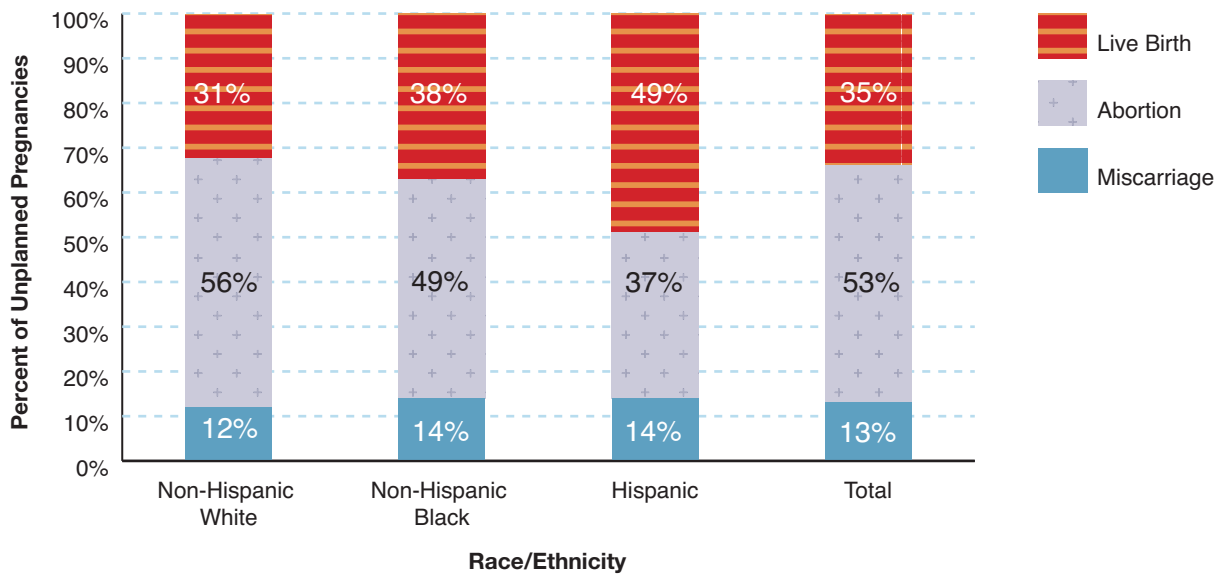


C-6. Resolution of Unplanned Pregnancies Among Unmarried Women Age 20–29 by Race/Ethnicity, 2001⁷

- ▲ Close to half (49%) of unplanned pregnancies to unmarried 20-something Latinas result in a live birth, compared to 38% of unplanned pregnancies to non-Hispanic black 20-somethings, and 31% of unplanned pregnancies to non-Hispanic white 20-somethings.
- ▲ More than half (56%) of unplanned pregnancies to unmarried non-Hispanic white 20-somethings end in abortion.
